







Americans think their distrust of the federal government and each other is a problem that gets in the way of solving issues.



Personal trust ranges across a spectrum, with differences in levels of trust tied to race and ethnicity, age, education, and household income.









Those with high personal trust have higher confidence in key leadership groups.






Many Americans have confidence in others to do the right thing in civic life at all times, but notalways.

2. Moving Colorado Ahead / Pandemic


A <u>poll</u> by More in Common and YouGov in late March found that:

90 percent of Americans feel "we are all in this together," and 82 percent believe "we have more in common than what divides us"

—numbers that have grown substantially over the last year within every shade of partisan belief. **More Americans believe they can count on one another** and report greater worries about the "American people's health" than about the health of their own families.

Which do you agree with more:


US Average	10/2018 Study	COVID- 19 (3/2020)	Changes between Studies



2019: New Jersey Judiciary Releases Annual Bail Reform Report, with Additional Key Statistics

"This report shows that New Jersey's historic bail reform law has been a resounding success. We have seen a **44 percent decrease in the pretrial jail population** and, at the same time, no meaningful increases in failures to appear in court or new offenses committed by people who are released pretrial."

Health Youth / Strong Colorado Fund

A Collaborative Partnership between the Colorado Department of Law and Rocky Mountain Health Plans, a UnitedHealth Group company.

UnitedHealth Group pledged \$5 million to support nonprofit organizations that offer mental health support and services to empower youth as well as help them avoid involvement in the criminal justice system and the school-to prison pipeline. (April 20, 2021)

Shared Principles for County/State Partnerships


- Always engaging and collaboration on statewide legislation, on the front-end
- Providing resources to assist counties
 - POST scholarships for rural law enforcement agencies
- Never issuing unfunded mandates upon local governments
 - full funding for body-cameras for local law enforcement
 - local funding to implement 48 hour release requirement legislation for rural DAs
