1862

The Morrill Act of 1862 is signed by President Lincoln

The Morrill Act granted land for the establishment of agricultural colleges throughout the U.S.

1887

Hatch Act of 1887 establishes Ag **Experiment stations**

These stations served as the foundation for what would later become CSU Extension.

1912

Oct 1, 1912 - Logan County, Colorado hires first Farm Management **Extension Agent, D.C.** Bascom

D.C. Bascom officially becomes Colorado's first County Extension Agent. Other counties including El Paso, Pueblo, Mesa, Boulder, Morgan and Prowers, and the San Luis Valley would soon follow suit.



1930s

The Great Depression and the Dust Bowl

CSU Extension helps disseminate information and coordinate federal relief programs in Eastern Colorado, and creates rural electric and grain co-ops.

1970s

Colorado Master **Gardener Program** begins; Extension hires first female county directors

1990s

Extension begins shifting from fact bulletins to internetbased resources and education

2023

Eligible Extension staff transition to Faculty



1902

4-H is created, initially started as a youth ag program in Ohio

The 'clover' emblem was designed in 1910, and by 1912 they were officially called 4-H clubs.



1940s

World War II

Extension agents provide ag expertise to help boost food production and educate communities on safe food preservation.



2000s

CSU Extension operates out of 54 counties; Agents begin work in climate-smart ag & energy conservation



The Colorado Agricultural College is established

The college would later become Colorado State University.




Smith-Lever Act creates the Cooperative Extension System

Individual county agreements indicate the funding types for each Extension position:

100% County; 50% County/50% CSU; or Formula (15-20% County/80-85% State/Federal)

Formula-funded: The County pays a matching of funds based on a schedule adopted annually by the CSU System Board of Governors. CSU Extension pays the balance of salary and benefits costs. Employees are CSU Extension employees. County funding is subject to annual appropriations.

CSU'S RURAL INITIATIVE



In 2021, the CSU System Board of Governors voted to invest \$8.5 million over three years to expand the University's support for rural Colorado students and communities.
