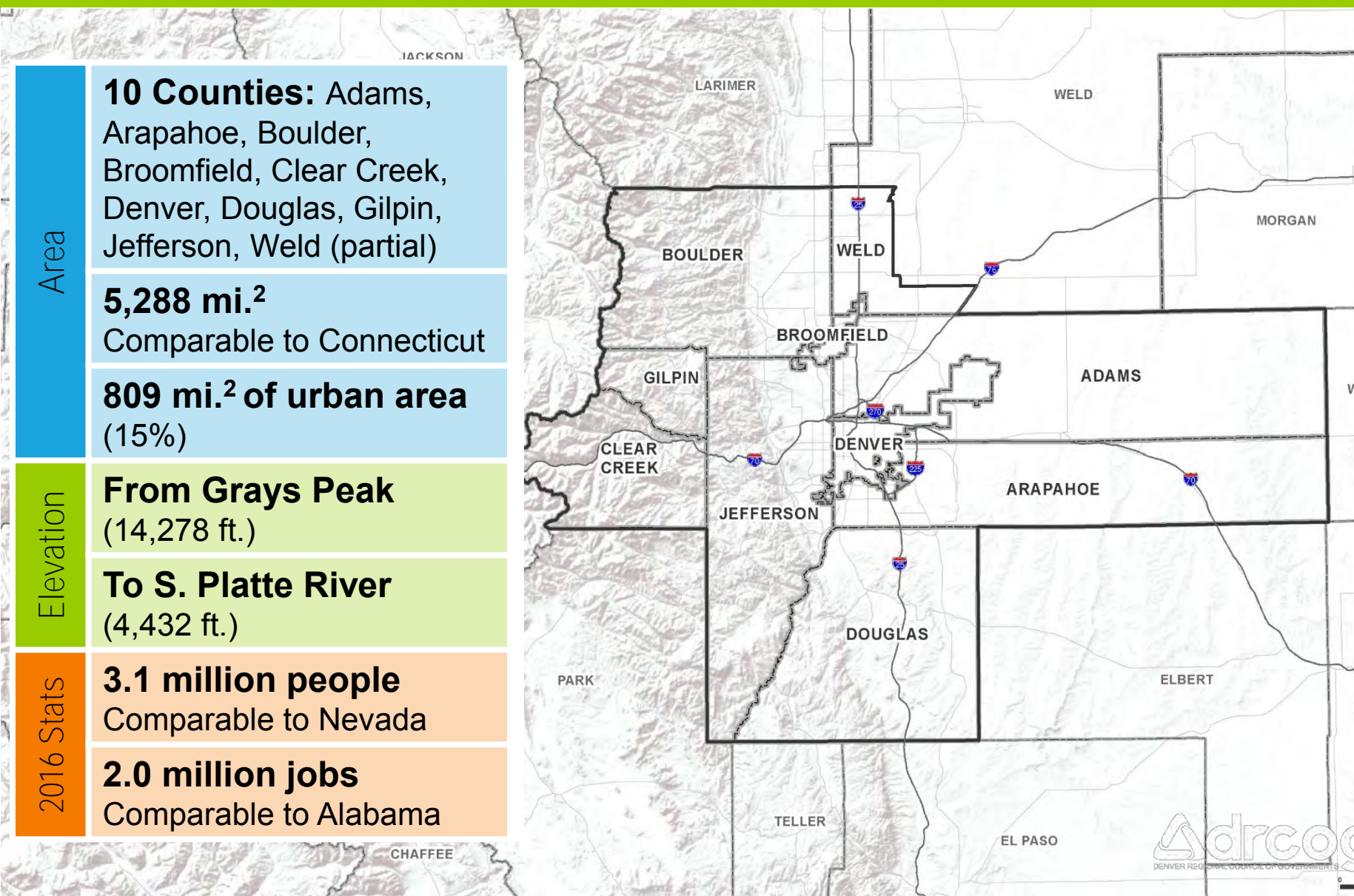

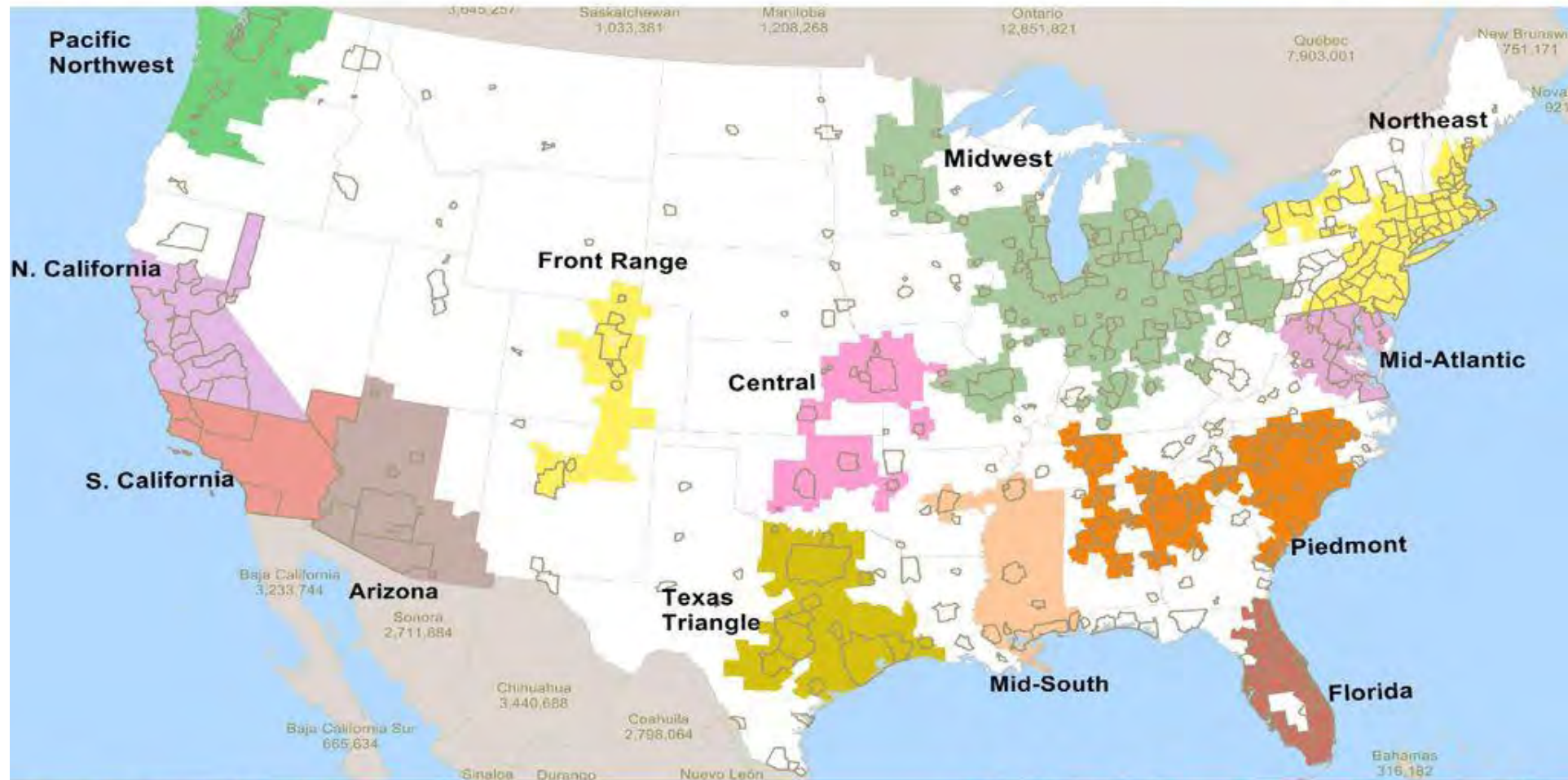

Megaregions and MPO Boundaries



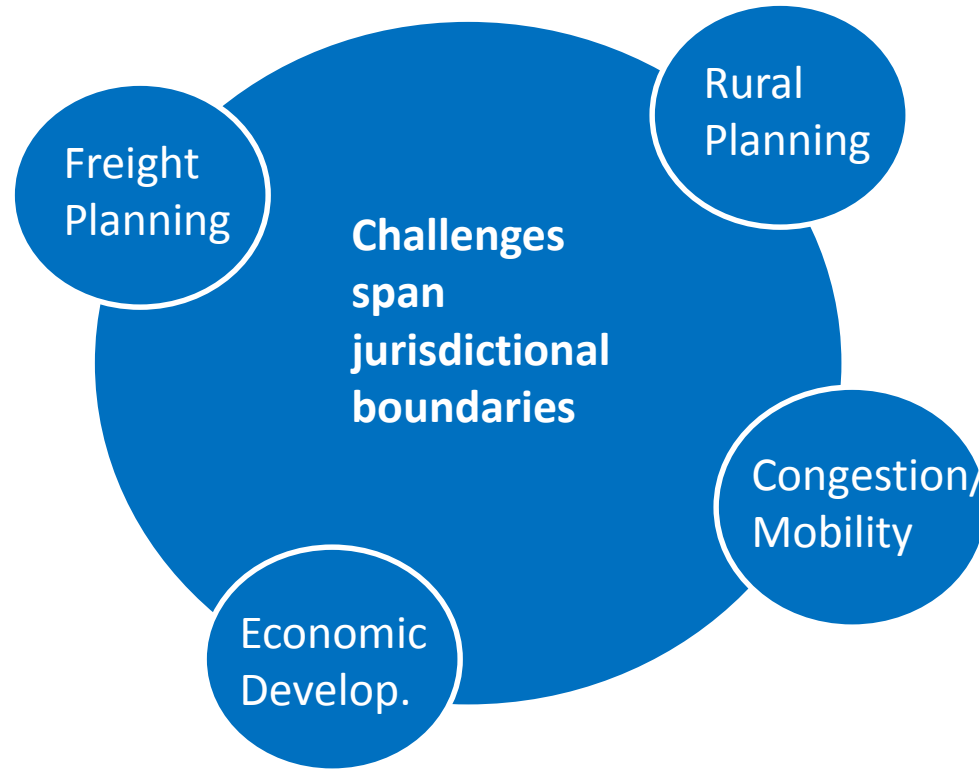

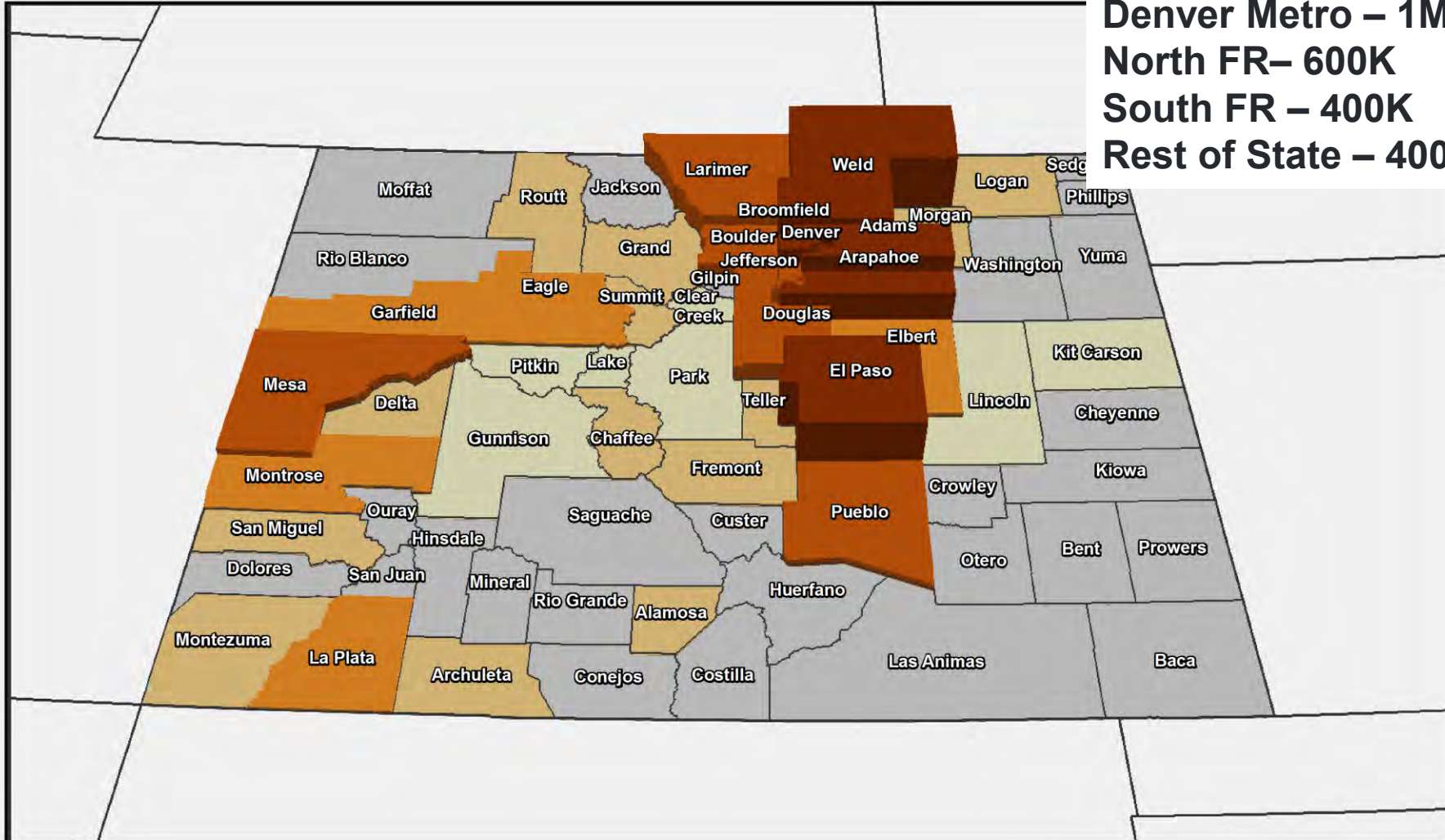

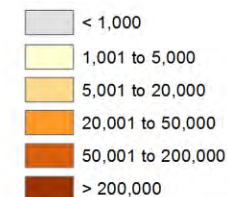


State – 2.4 million

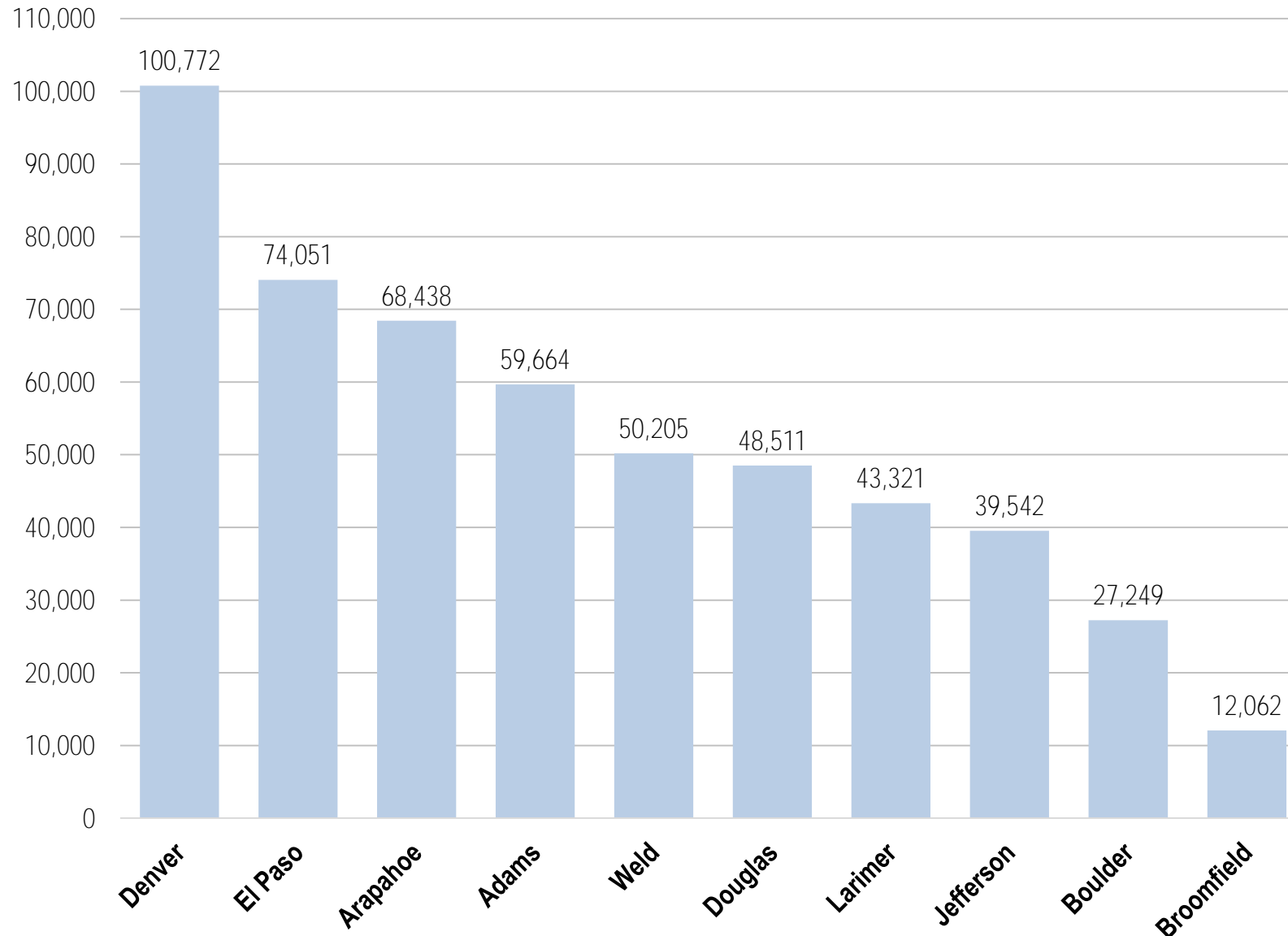

Front Range Counties Share of Colorado's Growth (2010-2017): 93.7%

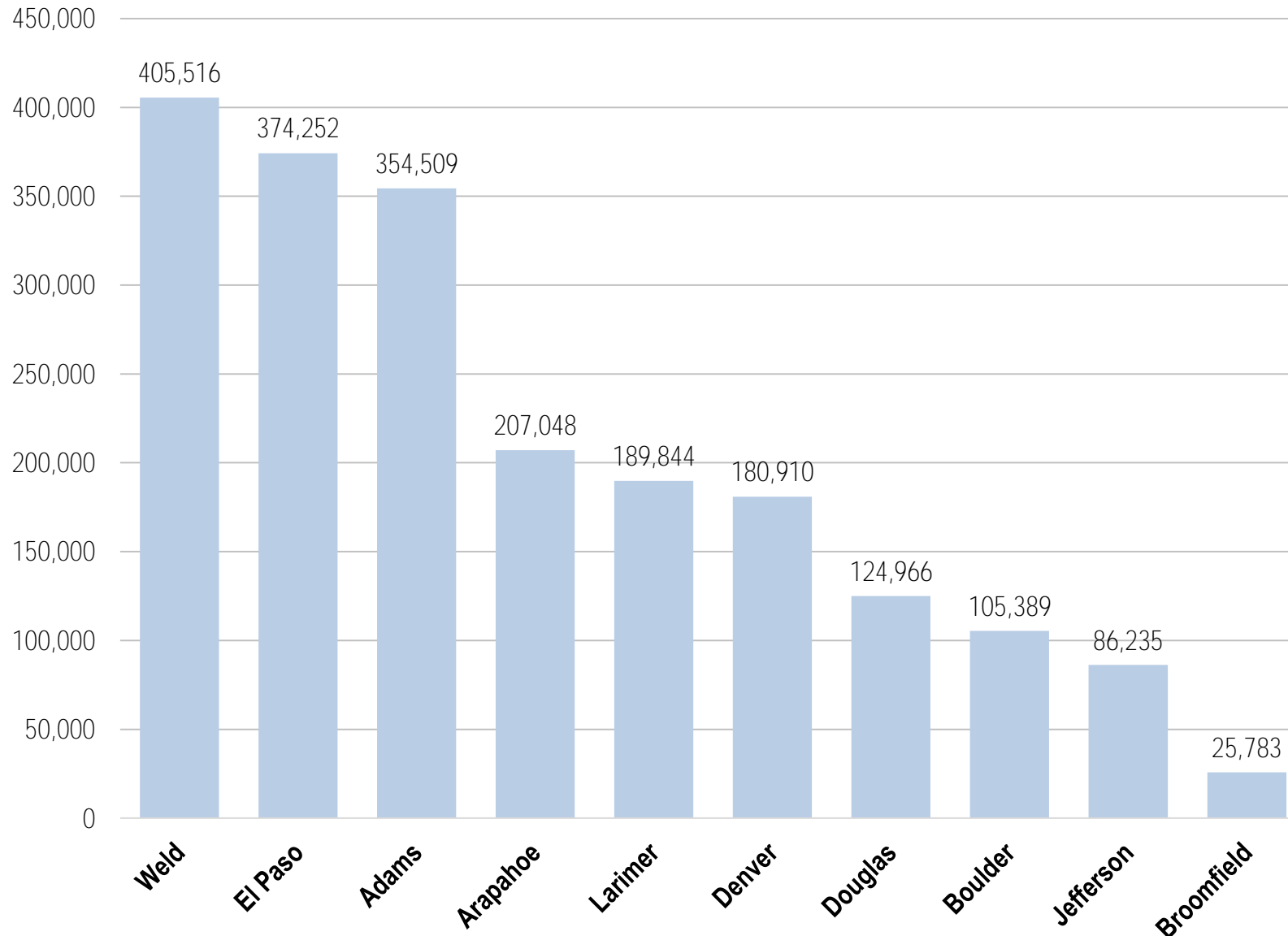


Growth in Population in Front Range Counties (2010 to 2017)





Projected Growth in Population in Front Range Counties (2017 to 2050)





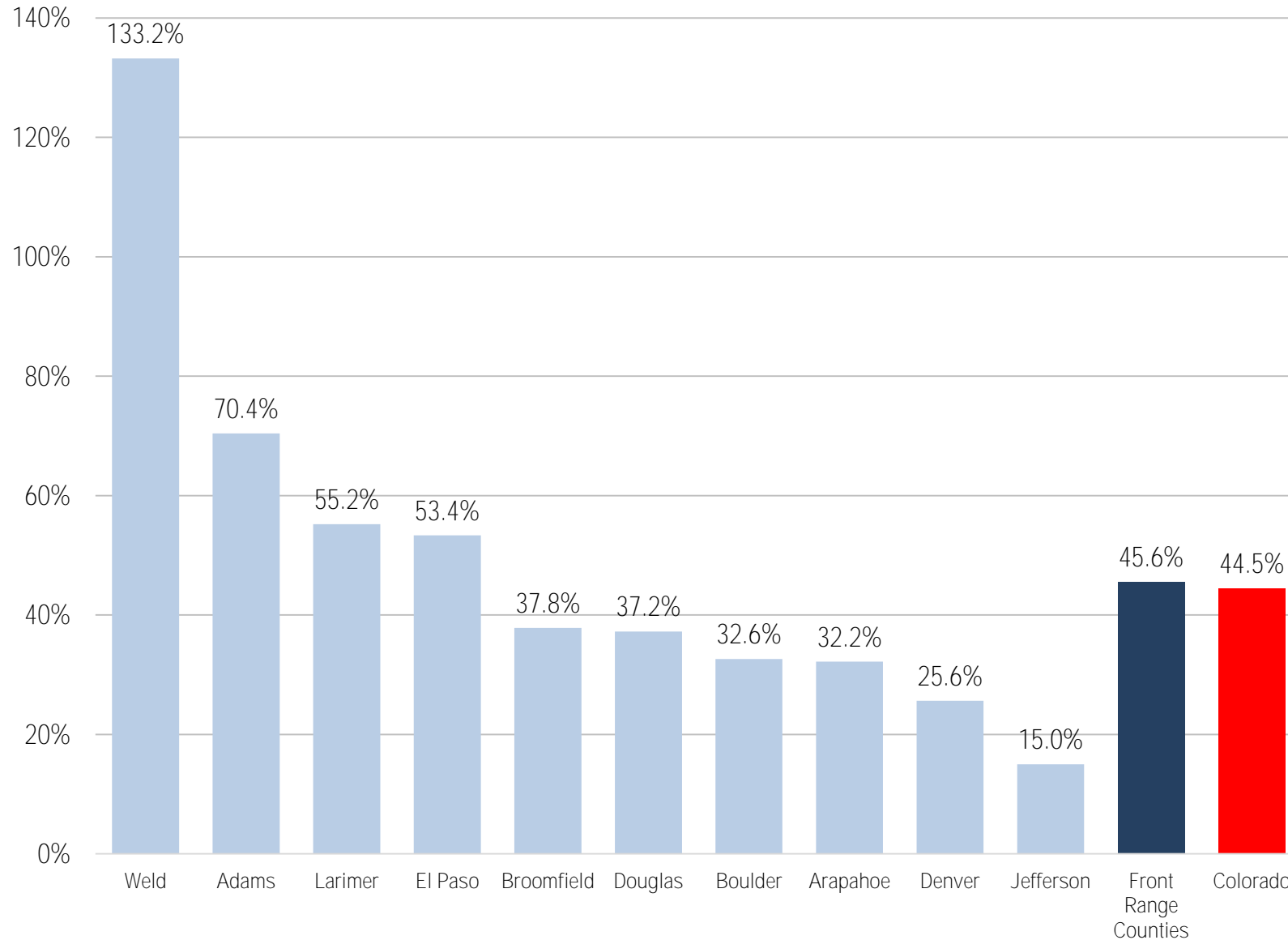

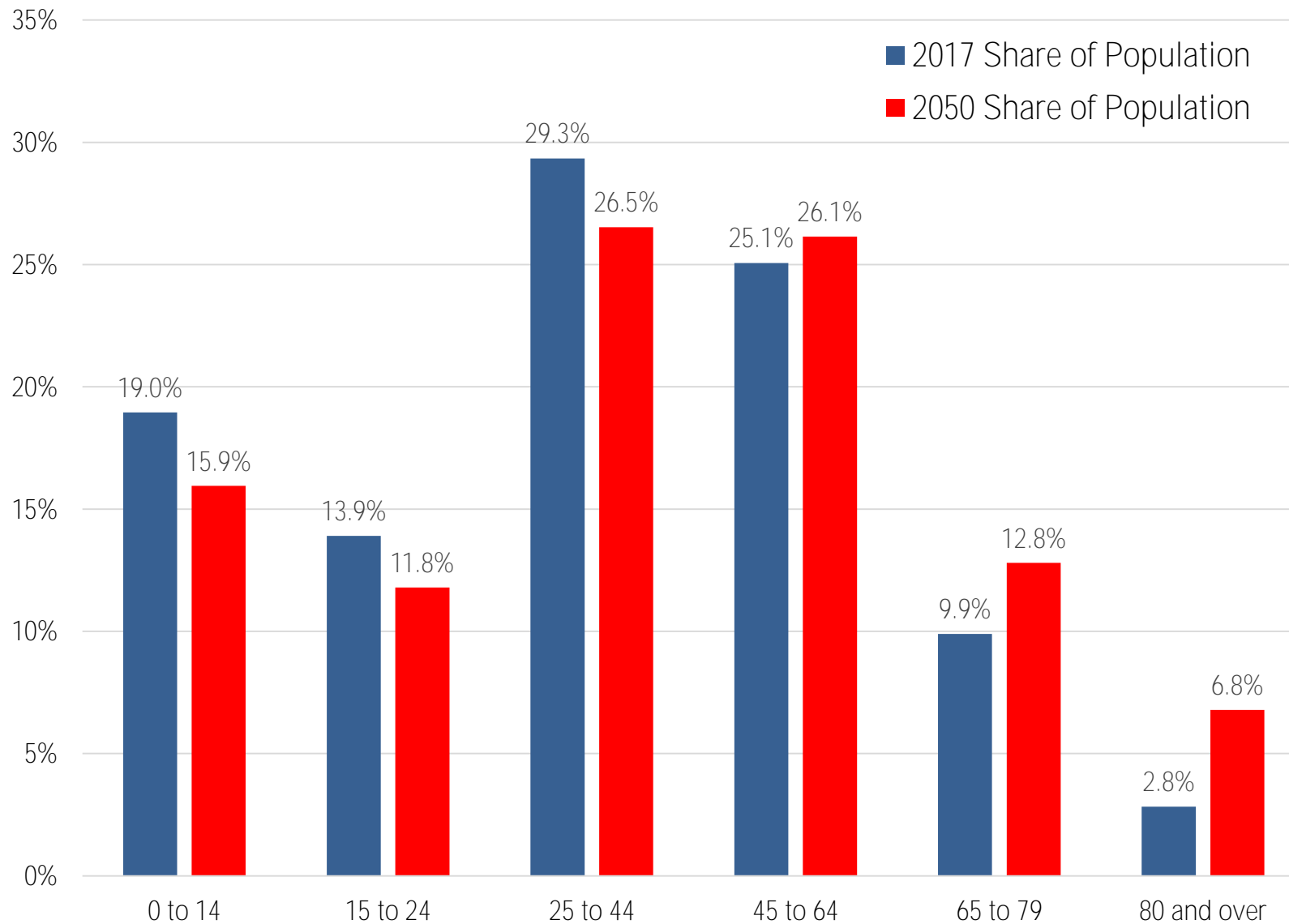


Percent Growth in Population in Front Range Counties (2017 to 2050)

Front Range Transportation

- Approx. **70%** of the State's VMT
- Over **2 million** trucks trips per day
- **85%** of the state's transit ridership
- Approx. **100,000 workers** commute between regions
- Approx. **35-40%** of the state highway VMT is on I-25 and I-70 within the front range.



Benefits

- Coordinate infrastructure investment
 - Better coordination
- Share best practices
- Promote data collection, sharing and use
- More competitive towards federal grants
 - e.g. INFRA, Build, etc.
