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

The allocation amount is based on a hypothetical \$1 billion gross settlement for Counties and Cities, of which \$150 million will be reserved for the Class Members' Special Needs Fund⁽ⁱ⁾ and \$100 million will be reserved for a Private Attorneys' Fee Fund⁽ⁱⁱ⁾, which results in \$750 million for the Initial Distribution to Counties & Cities. 
