FUNDING BACKGROUND

VETERANS TRUST FUND (VTF)

ESTABLISHED BY COLORADO REVISED STATUE 28-5-709 (TOBACCO MASTER SETTLEMENT) OVERSIGHT BY COLORADO BOARD OF VETERANS AFFAIRS AND DVA VETERANS ASSISTANCE GRANT (VAG)

ESTABLISHED BY COLORADO REVISED STATUTE 28-5-712 OVERSIGHT BY DMVA AND DVA









PURPOSE OF FUNDING

- <u>Veterans Trust Fund IS DESIGNED TO</u>: ASSIST VETERANS IN NEED OF FINANCIAL OR MATERIAL ASSISTANCE
- Veterans Assistance Grant IS DESIGNED TO: INCREASE VETERANS HEALTH AND WELLBEING
- <u>FUNDS MUST BE USED TO SERVE COLORADO VETERANS WITH A</u> RELEASE OR DISCHARGE FROM ACTIVE DUTY THAT IS OTHER THAN DISHONORABLE





WHO CAN APPLY?

- <u>VETERANS TRUST FUND</u> NONPROFIT NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED BY CONGRESS AS AN ORGANIZATION THAT CAN PROVIDE SERVICES TO VETS UNDER TITLE 38, USC.
- <u>VETERANS ASSISTANCE GRANT</u> A 501(C) NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION OTHER THAN A 501(C) 19 OR 501(C)23, OR A GOVERNMENT ENTITY LOCATED IN THE STATE OF COLORADO THAT PROVIDES DIRECT ASSISTANCE TO VETERANS











 AN ORGANIZATION MAY NOT RECEIVE FUNDING FROM BOTH GRANT PROGRAMS DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY









2021-2022 FUNDING OVERVIEW





Other-Electric scooter for disabled veteran to secure employment, storage unit fees, stand down initiatives, furnace repair, roof repair








2022-2023 VAG Geographic Funding Overview

REQUIREMENTS AND LIMITATIONS

- VTF FUNDS CAN BE
 EXPENDED ONLY FOR VETERANS IN
 NEED OF MATERIAL OR
 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE MAY
 SUPPORT SEVERAL PROGRAMS
 VIA SUBCONTRACT OR LETTERS
 OF AGREEMENT MAY NOT
 SUPPORT MEMORIALS, CLUB
 RENOVATIONS, HONOR GUARDS OR
 TRIBUTES TO VETERANS
- \$100,000 Maximum Allowable
 Office supplies allowed (up to \$1200 per grant year)

 VAG • APPLICANT ORGANIZATION MUST PROVIDE DIRECT SERVICES—STRICTLY PASS THROUGH FUNDS ARE NOT ALLOWED • \$100,000 MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE • CONSTRUCTION, REMODELING, MEMORIAL, HONOR GUARDS, VETERANS TRIBUTES ARE NOT ALLOWED • Applicant may request 10% of proposed budget for program costs

SUBMIT AN APPLICATION

- SUBMISSIONS ACCEPTED NO EARLIER THAN 1 DECEMBER
- NO LATER THAN 1 MARCH
- Applications are submitted electronically

BEST PRACTICES EXAMPLE- GRAND COUNTY

- Grand County Veterans Service Office (VAG Grantee)
 - Provides travel to medical appointments
 - Housing Stability
 - Mental Health Counseling
 - Vocational Assistance
 - Services are delivered through an Inter-Governmental Agreement between Summit and Grand Counties
 - Service area covers over 8,000 square miles
 - Excellent community partnerships
 - Strong Grant Management





BEST PRACTICES EXAMPLE- DOUGLAS COUNTY

- Douglas County (VAG Grantee) 2,428 Veterans are registered with Douglas County VSO
 - Provides short-term emergency financial assistance to veterans and their family members in Douglas County.
 - Housing Stabilization
 - Emergency Financial Assistance
 - Employment
 - Job Training
 - Mental Health Services
 - Strong Grant Management
 - Strong Community Partnerships
 - Community of Care Network
 - Douglas County Veterans Monument Foundation
 - Local American Legion & VFW

SURVEY Results indicate that 100% of veterans are satisfied with the services provided by Douglas County VSO





Best Practices Examples- City & County of Broomfield

- City & County of Broomfield (VAG Grantee) Grant funds are used to provide financial assistance to veterans who demonstrate a need for specific types of assistance and where a gap of services currently exist.
 - Emergency Financial Assistance
 - Utilizing funds from the 2022-2023 VAG grant, grantee prevented two veterans from being evicted during the current grant cycle
 - Food/Gas cards
 - Automobile Repair
 - Strong Community Partnerships
 - Strong Grant Management
