# Colorado River District

The Colorado River District was formed in 1937 to lead in the protection, conservation, use, and development of the water resources and;

To safeguard for Colorado all waters of the Colorado River to which the state is entitled.



# Unaided awareness of the River district as an entity helping protect water resources has remained the same over time.

Funding drinking water remained the most important project of the measure.

In 2018, three key issues came to light:

- Declining tax revenue from the energy industry
- Revenue ratcheting down due to the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights
- The Gallagher Amendment's reduction in assessment rates

In July 2020, the Colorado River District's Board of Directors adopted a resolution to ask voters in November to support a property tax increase to 0.5 mills.

To ultimately..... debruce and create a grant program

# 2020 Ballot Initiative Language

"Shall the ...Colorado River District taxes be increased by an amount up to \$4,969,041 in 2021 (which increases amounts to approximately \$1.90 in 2021 for every \$100,000 in residential home value)...... by:

- Fighting to keep water on west slope
- Protect adequate water supplies for west slope farmers and ranchers;
- Protecting sustainable drinking water supplies for West Slope Communities; and
- Protecting fish, wildlife, and recreation by maintaining river levels and water quality;....."
